

Pioneers to Prayers

One Day Itinerary

Begin the day by experiencing life as it was on the frontier in 1779 at **Mansker's Fort**. Costumed docents and volunteers will guide you through the fort and demonstrate skills of the period. Also on the grounds you will visit the **Bowen Plantation House**, among Tennessee's oldest homes. See how quickly life evolved on the frontier, from survival to estate living. (1 ½ hour, \$5.00pp)



Enjoy a delicious lunch at the **Hancock House**. This bed and breakfast was once a stagecoach stop on the Avery Trace. After the meal, hear stories of its past from the current owners. (1 ½ hour, \$18.00 pp)

The first stop of the afternoon is **Rock Castle**. Circa 1794, this home was built by General Daniel Smith with limestone and wood from the grounds. See where the General laid out the first map of Tennessee and hear how Smith's daughter eloped with Andrew Jackson's brother-in-law. (1 hour, \$5.00)



End the day at a one of a kind site for the world's largest religious television broadcast company, **Trinity Broadcast Network (TBN)**. Built as Twitty City by the late Country Music legend Conway Twitty, your tour includes the broadcast facilities, a Virtual Reality Theater showing original TBN produced religious movies, gift shop, café, and Conway's original mansion and gardens. (1 ½ hr, Free)
